- \$ 225 - Tack Stalls - Permanent & Temporary stalls (Thurs starting at NOON - Sun PM)
- \$ 13 - Shavings - Please order what you need by Monday prior to show.
- \$ 12 - Hay - Please order what you need by Monday prior to show (local orchard grass/timothy mix)
- \$ 25 - USEF DRUG FEE (per show/per horse, \$15 Drug/Meds & \$10 USEF fee)
- \$ 30 - Office fee for Friday show ONLY (non-refundable).
- \$ 35 - Office fee for Saturday/Sunday Show Only (non-refundable).
- \$ 45 - USEF Show Pass Fee (paid on-line only to USEF)
- \$ 55 - USDF non-member fee
- \$ 30 - Change fee for each change to the original entry (i.e., class change, time change).
- \$ 30 - Returned check fee.
- \$ 50 - Post entry fee per entry for entries RECEIVED after the closing date - if space allows.
- \$ 50 - Fee for non-competing horses (plus office fee and stabling) - if space available.

2. AWARDS

- Ribbons 1st - 6th place awarded for each class. There will be no mandatory prize-giving (awards) ceremonies.
- High Score Awards (exclude Freestyles, Dressage Equitation, and Young Horse classes):
 - Ribbon for high score with trophy and reserve (Open, AA, Jr if more than 3 in each division) each show (#332836 & #321) at Training Level, 1st Level, 2nd Level, 3rd Level, 4th Level, and FEI
 - Award for best ride by GMHA member (Open, AA, Jr) for both shows combined all 3 days.
 - Landsong's Gift- High Point Stallion Overall Training -Grand Prix. Tricolor champion ribbon. One award per show.
 - CVDA recognizes its members with a Year End Award for achieving a cumulative high point at GMHA's June, July and October dressage shows. Awards are made in the following divisions (CVDA Junior is under age 18):
 - Training, First - Fourth, & FEI Levels (Adult Amateur, Junior and Open) including Opportunity Classes.
 - Competitor must be a fully paid CVDA member at least three business days prior to the first GMHA dressage show of the year.
 - Horse/rider combination may only win a high score award at one level. If the combination is high score at more than one level, then the level with the highest score is awarded.
 - CVDA's GMHA High Score Coordinator will keep track of the scores for CVDA members at each of GMHA's three dressage shows. (For the purpose of these awards, the "show" is Friday - Sunday.) The nine awards will be announced prior to CVDA's annual meeting and awarded at the meeting.

3. ENTRY DETAILS

- Entries accepted on-line through www.HorseShowOffice.com
- Classes may be split, combined, or canceled at the management's discretion.
- Each competition requires a separate entry form. Office and USEF fees must be paid for each show.
- Scratches and changes to entry must be received in writing & fees apply (email acceptable).
- A complete entry includes the following when submitted:
 - Rider, horse, and owner USEF and USDF cards printed from everification.com or verified through www.HorseShowOffice.com
 - USEF Competing Members: SafeSport Training required prior to show date.
 - A current Coggins and Proof of Rabies vaccination within 12 months of competition (titer results are accepted with Veterinarian's note).
 - Proof of EIV and EHV vaccinations within six months of show.
- If entering on-line, please upload or send by email on the day of entry submission to be considered complete.
- Three (3) forms need to be signed: entry form for each show, Federation Entry Agreement for each show, GMHA waiver for each show weekend, and the USEF VT waiver for the season. If entering on-line, must be uploaded, or received by email on the day of entry submission to be considered complete. Electronic signature accepted by GMHA via DocuSign/e-verified signature platform, or hand sign" the GMHA waiver provided with the entry form.
- Payment (check payable to "GMHA", or by Visa, MasterCard, American Express).
 - Add 5% HSO/Credit Card Processing fee added if paying by credit card.
- Enter on-line or send to secretary postmarked on or after opening day. Accepted entries' checks will be cashed upon receipt. Wait Listed entry checks will be held. When an opening occurs, you will be notified immediately and if you agree to still enter, your check will be cashed. Entries must be RECEIVED by the secretary by Closing Date, or Post Entry fee will be charged.
- Refunds—Scratches before closing date will receive refund of entry and stabling fees less office fee(s). All refund requests must be received in writing (email acceptable). **No refunds after closing date, or for 'acts of God' which require management to cancel classes or day(s) of competition. 5% (HSO entry processing fees and credit card) processing fees are non-refundable.**
- Show will be run per the current USEF COVID-19 Action Plan and as supplemented by the current GMHA COVID-19 Action Plan. To review mandatory requirements for participants, go to www.USEF.org and to www.GMHAinc.org.

4. TIMES

Tentative times posted a week before event date on www.HorseShowOffice.com and www.gmhainc.org. Official times posted by noon on Thursday prior to show. Please double-check your ride times upon check-in.

5. STABLING

- Stall sizes for both permanent and temporary are 10' x 10' (stall doors included).
- 155 permanent box stalls with doors, with 41 additional temporary stabling (with doors) in Upwey Temp barn & Pavilion.
- \$225 block stabling only—Thursday starting at noon through Sundaypm.
- Early arrival/late departure must obtain permission from show management prior to closing date
- No stall deposit required. You will be billed a \$50 dirty stall fee for any stalls not stripped.
- No bedding provided. Shavings are available for purchase or bring your own. Orders placed with original entry will be delivered to your stalls prior to arrival.
- Hay available for purchase or bring your own. Orders placed with original entry will be delivered to your stalls prior to arrival.
- Night watch on grounds.
- Tack stalls may be available – competitors will be notified of status after closing day - \$225 block fee (3 nights) & should be included with your entry. Tack stall fee will be refunded if we aren't able to honor your request.
- NO REFUNDS ON STABLING AFTER CLOSING DATE, unless we have a wait list for stabling.
- Indicate what group/persons, with names, you wish to be stabled with clearly on your entry form. We will do our best to accommodate stabling requests on original entry forms.

6. ACCOMMODATIONS

- Visit www.gmhainc.org, or Woodstock Chamber of Commerce for listing of accommodations.
- ZONING PROHIBITS CAMPING OF ANY KIND (tents, trailer, camper etc.) on GMHA grounds— violators will be required to leave the show grounds.

7. FOOTING & LUNGING

- Standard arenas (20 x 60) for all tests: 4 competition arenas, 2 warm-up arenas, & lunge arena.
- Lunging NOT permitted in area with riders or on the grass.
- GMHA has EUROPEAN GEO-TEXTILE footing in ALL rings, including warm-ups.

8. ENTERTAINMENT

- Food available on-grounds during show hours.

9. OTHER

- Sound check for musical freestyles will be held Thursday pm and during breaks on Friday and Saturday before Freestyles. Freestyles will be held on Saturday afternoon. Sign-up in show office after providing music. GMHA accepts music recorded on CDs (provide 2 copies labeled with name/horse): .mp3 or .wav files sent through HorseShowOffice.com. Or reach out to show secretary for more information.
- Competition rings open for schooling on Thursday 12pm to 6pm. CLOSED 6pm on.
- Farrier and Veterinarian: on grounds and on call; phone numbers posted in program and at show office.
- Under-subscribed classes may be canceled or combined at management's discretion.
- Strict Dog Policy—Pet must be on leash. \$30.00 fee each off leash occurrence.
- No Smoking/Vaping permitted on grounds. You may smoke in your vehicle or at edge of GMHA property along road.
- Horses must wear bridle number when outside of stall.
- Horses may only be ridden by riders, trainers, coaches, and owners who have signed the appropriate entry blank and all waivers, including GMHA waiver.
- No cell phone coverage at show grounds. Wireless Internet is available on grounds at show office and the Youth Center.

DIRECTIONS:

- From West: N.Y. Thruway to I-87 Northway to Exit 20. Take Rt. 149 to Fort Ann, then Rt. 4 to Rutland & Woodstock. Take Rt. 106 (Woodstock Inn) south 5 miles to GMHA.
- From South: I-91 to Ascutney exit. 8 Rt. 131 west 7 mi. to Rt. 106 north 12 mi. to GMHA.
- From East: I-89 to Exit 1 in Vt. Take Rt. 4 into Woodstock. Then Rt. 106 south to GMHA.

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulteur or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of _____ (Competition). I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR907.4.

If not currently a USEF Active Competing member or Subscriber and competing only in classes that are exempt from membership requirements, I acknowledge and agree that I will be enrolled at no cost as a USEF Fan and my USEF Fan Account will continue to annually automatically renew unless and until USEF determines in its sole discretion to terminate my Fan account. Additionally, I acknowledge that the benefits of a USEF Fan are subject to change without notice. I acknowledge that I may opt out at any time by going to My USEF Dashboard or calling (859) 810-8733.

WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT



For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and GMHA, Inc. ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

WARNING:

Under Vermont Law, an equine activity sponsor is not liable for an injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities that are obvious and necessary, pursuant to 12 V.S.A. § 1039.

C. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the USEF Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any USEF Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any USEF Event.

D. WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNITY: In conjunction with my participation in any USEF Event, I hereby release, waive and covenant not to sue, and further agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the following parties: USEF, USEF Recognized Affiliate Associations, the United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee (USOPC), USEF clubs, members, Event participants (including athletes/riders, coaches, trainers, judges/officials, and other personnel), the Event owner, licensee, and competition managers; the promoters, sponsors, or advertisers of any USEF Event; any charity or other beneficiary which may benefit from the USEF Event; the owners, managers, or lessors of any facilities or premises where a USEF Event may be held; and all directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, and volunteers of any of the aforementioned parties (**Individually and Collectively, the "Released Parties" or "Event Organizers"**), with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature ("**Liability**") which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my participation in the USEF Events, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties.

E. Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$100), 5-years (\$400), or life (\$2,000). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$80). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$280) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$55 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$45). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$95. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$140) is eligible for Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.

Excerpts from USEF Rule Book

“EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.”

Sharps Containers Requirement – GR1210.4

Competition management shall place a minimum of one sharps container per each competition, whether or not stabling is provided. Additionally, at least one sharps container per fifty occupied stalls for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments in convenient locations in barns housing competition horses. It is competition management’s responsibility to replace such containers when full and dispose of them properly. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. Competition management will place a notice of this requirement either in its prize list or on a specific handout given to trainers on check in at the competition. If local law has different requirements, local law will prevail. Competitions failing to comply with placing the required number of containers on the show grounds will be considered in violation of the rules and may be subject to penalty as determined by the CEO or his designee and/or the Hearing Committee.

Membership Statement – GR901.9

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Motorized Vehicle Statement – GR1301.7 and GR1301.8

Minors who do not have a valid driver’s license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver’s license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver’s license to operate, including but not limited to Segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed “unsafe use” if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Pony Measurement Statement – DR 135

For Pony measurement, the owner or agent must notify competition management and/or competition secretary, and request a measurement within five days of the start of the competition. A \$100 fee will be incurred to cover the measurement session and scheduling and cost of the veterinarian.

Headgear Rule – GR801

All competitors must follow the rules regarding Headgear, which can be found in GR801.

SAFE SPORT STATEMENT: Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement, to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org

Bridle & Bit Checks - DR126.2.i.1.a

New bridle & bit check procedures: Per the updated bridle & bit inspection requirements in USEF Rulebook DR126.2.i.1.a (pg. 48) Technical Delegates (TD) are now required to inspect at least 50% of bridles & bits of horses entered in the competition. Along with ringside inspections the TD will be walking through the barns inspecting bridles & bits.



2026 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2026 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s).

A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

- Horses must be entered in qualifying and championship classes under their official recorded names and ownership as specified in USEF GR1102.3, and transfers of ownership or lease registrations must be completed in compliance with USEF rules GR1105 and GR1108 prior to the competition in order for the horse to compete under the name of the new owner or lessee. (USEF DR127.2)

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual Recorded Farm/Business (with Senior Active Competing Farm Owner in good standing)). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.

* PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider.

Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program

The USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program recognizes adult amateurs competing in equitation and promotes correct seat, position, and use of the aids in dressage. An Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class presented by Big Dee's Tack and Vet Supply will be held in conjunction with each of the nine USDF Regional Dressage Championship competitions, providing adult amateurs with additional opportunity for recognition. Ribbons awarded through 8th Place and gift certificates awarded to top four riders.

Adult amateurs wishing to qualify to compete in an Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final may do so by meeting the following requirements.

Qualifying Requirements

To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have

- a) Earned a score of 70% or higher in any dressage seat equitation class (except walk/trot) at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Dressage competition within the qualifying period of the applicable regional championship.
- or
- b) Qualified to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles).

Membership Requirements

- Rider must have a USDF Participating Membership at the time the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Rider must be an adult amateur, in accordance with GR1306 of the USEF rules, and be designated with USEF as an adult amateur when the score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Owner must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
